What's Up in the Subjects

MATH- We are working in on *Unit 15: Plane Figures and Geometric Concepts*. Students can identify and label points, lines, line segments, and rays. We can measure, draw, and classify angles.

SOCIAL STUDIES- We have explored Chapter 10. We discussed the battles of Lexington and Concord as well as how the Battle of Bunker Hill brought the colonies closer to independence from Britain. Students learned why the Declaration of Independence is important to America. Test 10 will be next Thursday, June 3rd.

ENGLISH- We are finishing *Unit 5: Pronouns and Writing That Compares*. We finished our drafts of comparative writing and used comparing and contrasting words. Unit 5 test is Friday, June 4th.
